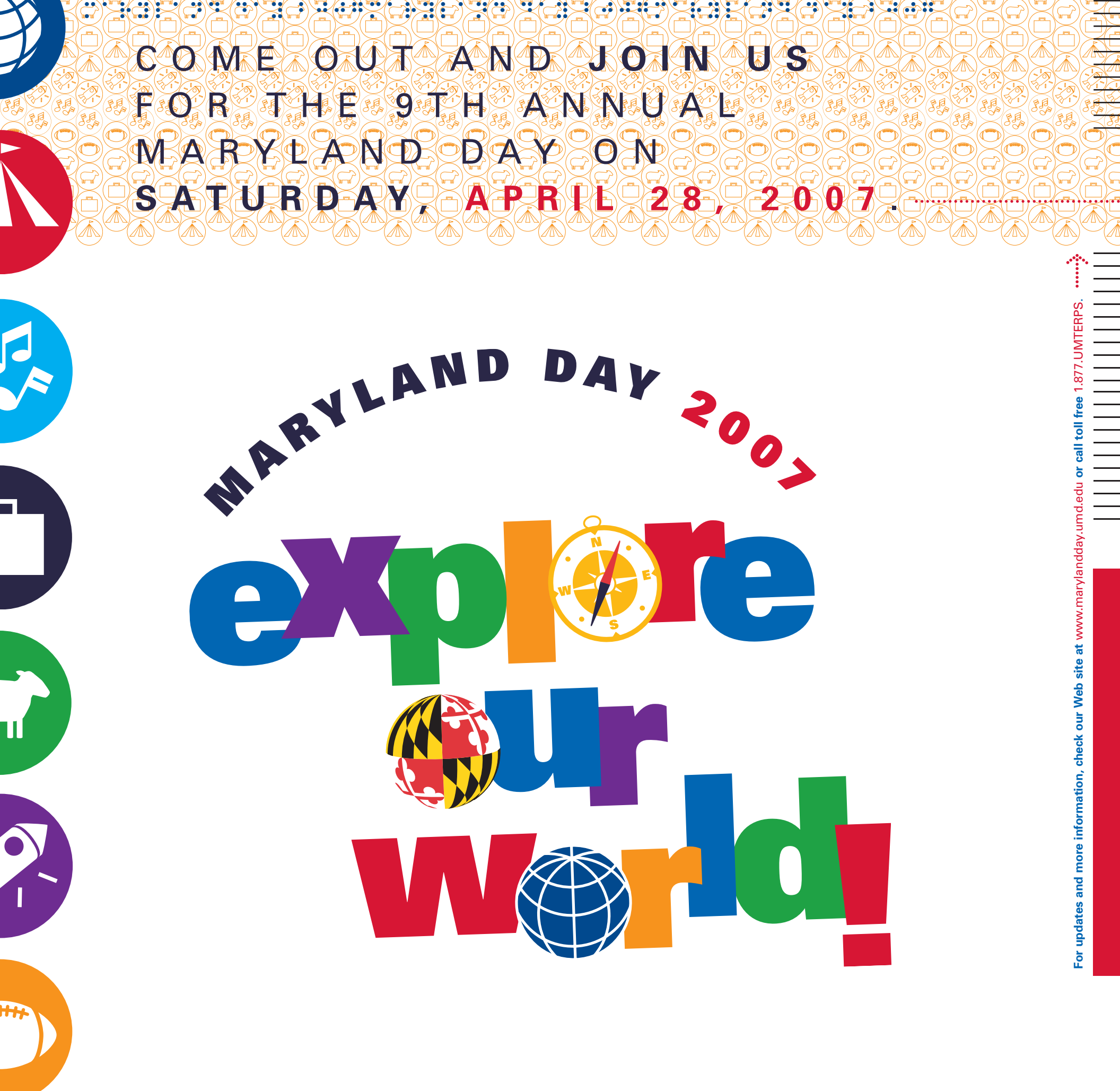

 **terp town center**  
 Home to the university's premier library and a central location for campus activity, McKeldin Mall becomes Terp Town Center for the day. Here, you can learn more about the university, its 13 schools and colleges, and all sorts of campus services. Visit the original Testudo, sit by the beautiful Omicron Delta Kappa fountain, catch live hourly performances under the Big Top and find a bite to eat.


 **global village**  
 Come see international cooking demonstrations or dance to a different beat in this year's new Global Village, located on the outskirts of Terp Town Center on Hornbake Plaza. Learn how Maryland's international community and partnerships enhance the university's position as a global leader in providing higher education to students from around the world, as well as its standing as a top public research and land-grant university.

 **sports & rec row**  
 If you're interested in trying a new sport or meeting some of the university's coaches and student-athletes, then head over to this area. Home to Chevy Chase Field at Byrd Stadium, the Eppley Rec Center, Cole Field House and Comcast Center, this area offers a glimpse of top-notch facilities for athletes of all types. After climbing the "Beast" and trying flat-water kayaking, stop by the Samuel Riggs IV Alumni Center to meet fellow alumni and friends.


 **science & tech way**  
 Come see where physics, biology, engineering, chemistry, mathematics and more collide—with wonderful results—at Science & Tech Way. Tour the historic Glenn L. Martin Wind Tunnel and the new Kim Engineering Building. Join researchers in experiments, view their exhibits and pick their brains.

 **biz & society hill**  
 One of the newest academic units, the 20-year-old College of Behavioral and Social Sciences, is home to some of the university's most popular majors. It shares this area with exhibits from the architecture, business, journalism, public affairs and social sciences programs. Here, experts can assess your career potential, test your terrorism IQ and share insights on voting in America.

 **ag day avenue**  
 It all began as the Maryland Agricultural College in 1856 and Ag Day celebrations have been a university staple since 1924. Our mission, once to teach young men farming techniques, has significantly broadened. Today, students in the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources research food safety and nutrition, as well as diseases affecting animals and humans. Stop by, spend some time with the farm animals that still play a vital role and learn about modern agricultural work.

 **arts alley**  
 Toot your own horn, see how a piano is tuned or take in a dance performance in Arts Alley. Artists of all types are showcased at the modern Clarice Smith Performing Arts Center, Tawes Fine Arts Building and others. Be sure to catch musical recitals, theater games and art exhibits as well.

## Getting here


 **By Car**  
 For detailed directions from your location and for parking information, call us toll free at 1.877.UMTERPS or log on to the Maryland Day 2007 Web site at [www.marylandday.umd.edu](http://www.marylandday.umd.edu).

The University of Maryland is located in College Park, Md. Arrive via I-95 (exit 27) or via Washington's Capital Beltway, I-495 (exit 25). Follow along exit ramp to Route 1, Baltimore Avenue. Follow Route 1 South to one of two main entrances to the campus (see map, pages 8–9).

**Entrance Option 1: Route 193**  
 After about one mile on Route 1 South, exit right for Route 193 (University Boulevard) toward the Stadium entrance. Turn left at Stadium Drive (second light) and follow directions/signs to parking.

**Entrance Option 2: Route 1**  
 After nearly two miles on Route 1 South, turn right on Campus Drive and follow directions/signs to parking.

 **Parking**  
 Parking is free. Follow directional signs and traffic attendants to event parking areas. Please do not park in fire lanes. Disabled parking areas are reserved for vehicles displaying state-issued disabled permits.

 **By Metro**  
 We are conveniently located less than one mile from the College Park Metro Station on the Green Line. On Saturdays, trains arrive every 10 minutes between 8:00 and 10:00 am and every 12 minutes between 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Shuttle buses will run every 20 minutes to pick up and drop off visitors using Metro. The free Shuttle-UM to Metrorail pick-up/drop-off location is at Stamp Student Union.

 Attendees who need reasonable accommodations for a disability should make arrangements at least one week in advance by calling the Disability Support Service at 301.314.7682.



## Unstoppable.

The University of Maryland is on the move.

We're one of the nation's Top 20 public research universities and one of a handful of public universities whose computer science, mathematics, physical science and engineering programs all ranked in the Top 20. **Getting Around**

You can cover more ground if you use Shuttle-UM, which runs continuously all day. See our map on pages 8–9 for bus stops. Board our red and white buses, free of charge, at bus stops along the designated routes. Take the “North Campus” bus for those events located north of Campus Drive, and the “South Campus” bus for those south of Campus Drive. Signage and guides on the bus will help you determine the best stop for a particular event.

**First Aid and Safety**

A First Aid station is located on McKeldin Mall or you can visit the Health Center (see map, pages 8–9). In the event of severe weather or imminent danger, campus sirens will sound to signal all on campus to seek shelter in the nearest building.

**Rain Locations**

In the event of heavy rain, most outdoor events will move into the nearest building. These larger outdoor activities will move as follows:

**Restrooms**

There are restrooms available in every building on campus. Most buildings are open for Maryland Day and restrooms are marked for your convenience.

**Lost Person Protocol**

Immediately report a lost person to the closest Maryland Day volunteer (they’ll be wearing white t-shirts with “Explore our World” on the front). Stay in the area where you first lost your friend or loved one. Our Maryland Day staff will contact the appropriate authorities and an officer will come and help you.

**Information/Locator Service**

Need help finding an event? Stop by any of our strategically located Information/Locator Service booths, staffed by members of our university community (see map on pages 8–9). Here you can pick-up a Maryland Day 2007 Passport to learn more about the remarkable progress of this great institution and initiatives that are currently underway to maintain the momentum. Then collect stickers as you visit each Neighborhood (supplies are limited). Fill out an entry form and you may win a prize.
